Statement of Publication Ethics

The *Journal of Levantine Studies* (JLS) is a peer-reviewed, interdisciplinary journal published by the Van Leer Jerusalem Institute, a non-profit institution. JLS aims to reclaim the Levant as a historical and political concept and as a category of identity and classification by providing a unique platform for theoretical and empirical research. JLS is dedicated to upholding the highest standards of publication ethics, outlined in the <u>COPE Code of Conduct</u> for Journal Editors.

Duties of the Publisher and the Editorial Board:

All articles received by JLS are reviewed by the editorial board, which reserves the right to accept, reject, or request revisions of a submitted manuscript. All scholarly articles accepted for publication are sent to two experts in the relevant field. The peer review process is detailed in our "Submission Guidelines." JLS editors commit to judging each manuscript based only on its intellectual and scholarly merits and are responsible for ensuring the confidentiality of the authors and reviewers. JLS editors make an effort to include comments with each rejected manuscript; however, the editors reserve the right to reject a manuscript without extensive comments. While the editorial board is entrusted with ensuring the accuracy, quality, and integrity of the published manuscripts, JLS and the Van Leer Jerusalem Institute do not accept any legal responsibility or liability for any errors or omissions that may occur: all statements, facts, and views presented in JLS are the sole responsibility of the contributors.

Duties of Authors

By submitting a manuscript, authors attest that their manuscript has not been previously published or accepted for publication elsewhere, in whole or in part, in any language (unless the text in question is submitted for the purpose of translation); that the work is entirely their own; and that all sources are referenced as outlined in the "Submission Guidelines." Authors should not submit manuscripts that describe the same research or conclusions of previously published material. Simultaneous submissions, whereby authors submit the same manuscript to more than one journal, are not accepted. Authors commit to publishing their manuscript in JLS if accepted and commit to working, in a timely manner, with the JLS editorial staff in preparing the manuscript for publication. Authors must take care to delete any information in their manuscript that reveals their identity, in order to ensure the confidentiality of the peer review.

Duties of Reviewers

By agreeing to review a manuscript, reviewers commit to regarding any information in the manuscript as confidential, privileged information. Reviewers are expected to adhere to the JLS evaluation criteria, which ask the reader to judge a manuscript on the basis of its originality and level of scholarship. If the reviewers are not able to meet the agreed-upon deadline, they must notify the JLS staff.
